### **Resolution No.1:**

Meeting Chairman, Shri Nini Pertin, briefed on the purpose of organizing SAC meeting. He appealed the developmental departments and KVK to work in coordination to mobilize the natural resources of the district for sustainable farm production and economic returns for farming community. He called upon the farmers to participate in exposure visits to replicate innovative agricultural practices at their farm and acts as role models for fellow farmers. He also reminded the roles, responsibilities and rights of progressive farmers (Mr. Tokmen Perme and Mr. Raju Linggi) in availing govt. schemes and educating fellow farmers. Further he suggested Programme Coordinator to avail the farmer oriented benefits from different departments and agencies outside the state.

### Resolution No.2:

Dr. V. K. Sahgel, DVO, in his speech suggested farmers to participate in the on going training for drought mitigation fodder preservation and quality improvement programmes such as molasses and urea treatment of straws. He further appealed to the farmers to vaccinate their pigs with swine fever vaccines which are now available and suggested KVK to take initiatives for introduction of Duck as integrated component in aquaculture.

Fisheries Development Officer, Mr. Burman suggested KVK to introduce cat-fish (*pangassius ssp*) in progressive farmers ponds. He also suggested KVK to create awareness on utilization of fruit extract waste for production of nutrient enriched manures. He also suggested the multiple roles of duck in integrated farming system.

Mr. D. Sharma, Suptd. Of Crafts and Industries, suggested for selection of interested farmers for undergoing training on Apiary at Jorhat. He further suggested for taking up Apiary enterprise along with mustard cultivation for higher farm production and income.

Mr. T. Kombo, Branch Manager, APRB, Roing briefed farmers about the initiatives taken by him towards providing of financial assistance (KCC loan to farming community). He also appreciated the way KVK promoted farmers club availed KCC loan for vegetable cultivation.

Mr.S. K. Gautam, DHO also actively participated in the Programme.

### Resolution No.3:

Mr. Takmin Perme, Innovative farmers and APMC members from Jia village, suggested KVK to popularize vermicompost ; procurement of improved farm implements and maintaining at KVK farm and providing them to farmers on hire basis. He also further suggested to introduce Cotton as a means of crop diversification, to make initiatives for assisting farmers in procurement of improved breed of cattle (Holstein Freisian and Jersey crosses). He also shared and enriched his exposure visits to different states with farmers. He also suggested to maintain Soil Testing Laboratory for speedy analysis of the samples. He also suggested KVK for mushroom spawn production unit establishment at KVK for easy accessibility to farm women (SHGs) round the year.

Smti. K. Linggi, SHG Kebali village, appreciated the steps taken by KVK in organizing exposure visits for active SHG members for participation in value addition in fruits training programme. She suggested KVK to make necessary arrangement for supply of preservative required in juice making from oranges and pineapple.

Mr. Raju Linggi, a young energetic progressive farmer of Iduli village also actively took part in the meeting.

Mr. Jiko Linggi, Editor, Roing Standard Tribune also actively participated in the programme.

The programme ended with proposal with vote of thanks by Dr. Robindro Pukhrama, SMS (AH & Vety.). The whole technical session of the meeting was meticulously executed by Ms. Monika Panggam, SMS (Agronomy) of the KVK.
